- **The library** In 2002 with a group of friends we founded SOLAC. A small NGO, with the idea of improving the education in the poorest urban areas in Lima. In 2003 we started a project called "Biblioteca Comunitaria Alto Perú". It consisted in building a library for the school "Alto Perú". The children who studied there were under child labor at brick factories in the district of Huachipa. The library became the only building in all the school made of brick and concrete. We won a prize called "Perú Promesa" sponsored by the Kellogg Foundation and University of Pacifico.
- **2007 Earthquake** ([link](#)): In 2007 after the earthquake in Perú, we made several trips bringing relief and basic supplies to the small towns located in the provinces of Lima. Those towns had a significant struggle with the earthquake. We visited towns like Tupe, where was not possible to get there by car. We made more than five trips to different towns.
